The Vernon District Riding Club (VDRC) 2022 Celebration of Dressage Show is a sanctioned **GOLD** and **BRONZE** competition of Equestrian Canada, 201-11 Hines Rd., Ottawa, ON K2K 2X1and is governed by the rules of EC. (rule A602.1)

"Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of EC and will be held and judged in accordance with the EC Rule Book." (rule A602.2)

Per Article A801, every entry at an EC-sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider and horse shall be subject to the EC constitution and all rules of EC and any additional rules set by the competition. Do not participate in this EC-sanctioned competition in any capacity if you do not sonsent to be bound by the constitution and rules of EC and any additional rules imposed by the competitions. It is the responsibility of all individuals participating in any capacity in EC-sanctioned competitions to be knowledgeable regarding the EC constitution and the applicable rules of EC and the additional rules, if any, imposed by the competition. Do not participate in this EC- sanctioned competition in any capacity if you do not consent to be bound by the constitution and rules of EC and any additional rules imposed by the competition.

STATEMENT OF PRINCIPLES: Horse Health and Welfare

The health and welfare of horses in Canada is of the highest priority for Equestrian Canada (EC) and the Canadian equestrian industry and community we serve.

EC supports adherence to the humane treatment of horses in all activities under our jurisdiction. Under the EC Statement of Principles, all persons shall be committed to:

- a) upholding the welfare of the horse, regardless of monetary value, as a primary consideration in all activities;
- b) requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect, and the compassion that they deserve, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment;
- c) ensuring that owners, trainers, and exhibitors and their agents exercise appropriate care and responsibility in the handling, treatment, and transportation of their horses, as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose;
- d) providing for the continuous wellbeing of the horse by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort, and safety;
- e) continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare;
- f) requiring owners, trainers, and exhibitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules, and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competitions; and
- g) reviewing, revising, and developing competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of the horse.

In determining whether conduct or treatment is cruel, abusive or inhumane, the standard to be applied will be the conduct or treatment expected of a reasonable person who is informed and experienced in equine training and exhibition procedures.

Individuals who interact with horses must also adhere to EC's policies as they relate to horse welfare.

While the show will make every effort to adhere to the ride times published on Fox Village Dressage, short notice changes may occur.

SHOW OFFICE:

The show office is in the Club House and will be open at 7:00 am Saturday and Sunday.

"ORDER OF GO" SCHEDULE:

- Start time will be confirmed dependent on entries.
- It is anticipated that rides will begin at 8:00 am each day in designated Rings. See signs and stabling map for ring locations.
- There will be a one hour break approximately around noon each day.
- The warm-up ring will be open at 7:00 am. No warm-up is allowed in the designated show rings on the days of competition.
- Ring 1 will be available for use Thursday and Friday. Ring 1 is also an alternate show ring and may be used as determined by the show committee.

TACK & DRESS:

Tack & Dress according to 2022 EC Section E Rules. Note: all riders to wear approved helmets when mounted at the event location (Article E 4.0 Safety Headgear). See <u>Equestrian Canada Dressage Rules</u> for the 2022 Rulebook.

DEFINITIONS & ELIGIBILITY:

Adults: Individuals are adults, or seniors, from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 19.

Amateurs: Adults eligible to compete in EC Amateur Classes as per EC Article A902. A person competing in EC amateur classes must hold a valid EC Sport Licence and have a current Amateur status.

Coach: Equestrian Coaches who have completed an evaluation and are certified by EC in partnership with the Coaching Association of Canada and hold a current coaching status with EC.

NEW FOR 2022 "When registering for EC sanctioned competitions, athletes must indicate the name of their coach on the entry form or specify that they are self coached. Coaches from other countries, must be in good standing with their home federation and must declare/have proof of insurance. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article 102, Safe Sport Environments.

FEI Age Limitations: See Article E3.4.4, FEI Age Limitations

Juniors: Individuals are Juniors until the end of the calendar year in which they turn 18. Juniors are not eligible to compete in the amateur category.

Person Responsible: The Person Responsible (PR) for a horse must be an adult who has or shares responsibility for the care, training, custody, and performance of the horse, and who has official responsibility for that horse under EC Rules. The PR is liable under penalty provisions of the applicable EC Rules for any rule violations. Every entry form for an EC sanctioned competition must identify the PR and be signed by the PR. This definition was updated April 2018 Person Responsible Rule. The Person Responsible must hold an EC Sport Licence (see A801.6).

Ponies: A pony is a small horse whose height at the withers, having been measured on a smooth level surface, does not exceed 148 cm without shoes or 149cm with shoes.

LICENCE AND MEMBERSHIP:

- 2022 Bronze or Gold EC Sport Licences are required by competitors, owners or lessees, and individuals accepting responsibility for entries in an EC sanctioned competition.
- Valid EC Horse Records, 2022 EC Horse Activation are required for Gold competition.
- Vaccination documentation required.
- Horse Council B.C. or Provincial equivalent or USEF required.
- Temporary licences, Bronze licences and upgrades may be purchased with entry (Refer to the current EC schedule of fees). Horses without a valid EC Horse Record (Gold)must provide a completed temporary horse registration form and pay a \$73.00 fee.

FREESTYLES:

- All freestyles will follow the Division Classes on Saturday and be part of the Celebration of Dressage at approximately 3:30 p.m.
- Please provide your own music to the Show Secretary upon registration. If using a phone, please give
 note to entry secretary re: who will operate it. Music tests (for volume etc.) may be made any time
 Friday or lunch time Saturday

Freestyle Eligibility:

Freestyle riders in Gold and Bronze competition. (all EC levels and FEI freestyle levels offered)

- A horse/rider combination must have obtained the following prior to competing in a freestyle: a
 minimum score of 60% in a technical dressage test at the same level, or higher. The dressage score
 may have been obtained at an EC Gold/Silver dressage competition prior to the competition, or may
 be obtained at the same competition in which they wish to enter the freestyle. Article E 10.6.1
- Technical scores earned at silver competitions count toward entering freestyle in a Gold competition and vice versa.
- **Bronze** competitions require no minimum technical score. A rider in the Bronze competition may enter a freestyle without having ridden the technical test. (e.g. competes in first level technical and second level freestyle).

WESTERN DRESSAGE and WORKING EQUITATION DRESSAGE

- These classes are considered miscellaneous classes under EC rules and are not eligible for EC awards.
- Western Dressage Riders are required to wear approved protective head gear.
- Western Dressage tests AND Working Equitation tests are available upon request. Please specify which tests will be ridden on entry form.
- The Show Committee reserves the right to alter or combine classes, dependent upon the tests requested.

EQUITATION:

Rising Stars Equitation Division

This division has been created to emphasize the importance of equitation and its influence and effect on the performance of the horse.

This division will determine the Rising Stars Division

Champion and Reserve in both Gold and Bronze categories.

These are the levels and age groups:

Gold:	Bronze:
Training, First & Second Level	Training & First Level
10 -12 yrs.	10 -12 yrs.
13 -15 yrs.	13 -15 yrs.
16 -21 yrs.	16 -21 yrs.

The Rising Star Equitation Judging will be done during a regularly scheduled technical test. There will be the technical judge seated at C. The Equitation Judge will sit at H or M and judge only the rider's Equitation during the technical test. The Rising Stars Equitation score sheet has been designed for the Equitation judging. The scores from the Equitation Score Sheet (NOT the technical test scores) will be tabulated and the top two scores from each category will qualify for the "Ride Off". The "Ride Off" will bring the top riders from each division to the Dressage Seat Hack Class. Winners will be Rising Stars Champion and Reserve Champion.

Rosettes:

Rosettes to fourth (4th) place will be awarded at the completion of every class.

Scoring:

Points awarded by the judges are final.

Where there is only one rider in a class, percentages will be applied as follows:

1st place -60% or higher; 2nd 57% - 59.99%; 3rd 54 - 56.99%; 4th 51% - 53.99%.

Class Scores will be posted on the windows of the club house when the class is complete and scores are ready for posting. Tests will be available as quickly as possible.

Test and Rosettes Acceptance Location:

Tests and rosettes may be picked up at the prize area in the club house on completion of each class/level and posting of results.

Presentations for Championships and Awards:

Freestyle and Equitation awards will be presented at the completion of the class and the posting of the results. Riders should be prepared to present themselves in show attire, unmounted, at the club house area for award presentation and pictures. Pictures may include the horse at the show's discretion. The Show Committee may select photo opportunities depending on time.

The Show Committee reserves the right to alter or combine any awards.

Gold and Bronze Division and Category Championships:

- A Championship will be presented in both the Bronze and Gold competitions for each Division and Category with 3 or more entries.
- There will also be a championship presented for the Western Dressage/Working Equitation Division and the Thoroughbred Incentive Program.
- ❖ In Levels with less than 3 riders the Show Committee reserves the right to alter or combine the Championships presented.
- The Champion will be determined by the horse/rider combination percentages achieved in the 2 designated classes at each level (E9.10.4).

- The designated classes are Test 2 on Saturday and Test 3 on Sunday at each level. These class names and numbers are labelled with a 'C' in the CLASSES OFFERED.
- In the event of a tie for the championship, the competitor with the highest single percentage score (test) is declared the winner.
- Any horse receiving less than 50% on a technical test will not receive an award as per Art. E 9.10.7.
- **t** Test of choice (TOC) and Freestyle classes do not qualify for championship calculations.

FEI Champion

FEI Champion will be determined by the highest two combined technical scores earned over two days of FEI classes including Para.

SPECIAL AWARDS:

Freestyle High Score

❖ High Score Freestyle will be awarded to the highest freestyle score in either of the Bronze and Gold competitions.

Adult Amateur High Score

High Score AA will be awarded to the highest amateur score in either of the Bronze and Gold competitions.

Most Harmonious Ride of the Show:

The "Ride of the Show" will be chosen by the Judges over two days.



DRESSAGE BC AWARDS:

Dressage BC Adult Amateur Awards Program 2022 is for Adult Amateurs riding Training though Fourth Level, no application or entry fee required. Score requirements: three scores in Test 3 of the Level, from two different judges (M status or above), from 3 different recognized EC Gold competitions in BC, average score of 60% or higher to qualify. Full details at www.dressagebc.ca.

GENERAL SHOW INFORMATION:

THE CURRENT EC RULE BOOK WILL BE IN EFFECT

- "Horses entered in any class at a competition may be selected for equine medication control testing while at the event location" (A602.5).
- Riders mounted on a horse must wear ASTM/SEI or BSI/BS EN approved helmet, with safety harness correctly fastened.
- Only horses wearing a competition number are allowed on the grounds during competition days.
- Competition numbers must be worn by the horse or rider/handler at all times the horse is on the grounds (except when in stall or trailer).
- Appropriate footwear must be worn when mounted.
- Any contestant demonstrating unsafe or unsportsmanlike behaviour will be disqualified for the remainder of the show without refund of entry fees.
- Dogs must be kept on leashes. Please 'pick up'!
- Lunging is only allowed in specified ring from 6:00 a.m. to 7:00 a.m. The round pen by the entry gate is open at any time.
- The management reserves the right to limit entries or refuse an entry.
- The management reserves the right to decide any point not covered in the rules and correct any error or omission in the program.
- Protests or objections will be handled by the management.
- Hors Concours entries accepted at full entry fee and subject to all EC rules including EC sport licences and EC Horse Records, but are not eligible for placings, ribbons, or awards.
- Copies of the EC tests may be found at https://www.equestrian.ca/sport/dressage/tests. Please be sure you have the current edition of the tests.

- Note: 2017 amendment to Error Penalization: 1st Error = 2 points, 2nd Error = 4 points, 3rd error = elimination. However, at the discretion of the judge, the rider may continue to finish to test. See Art E 9.3.2.
- If selected for a tack check, it is the responsibility of the contestants to present themselves, while still mounted to the Steward immediately following their ride. Failure to do so will incur elimination.
- Failure to ride at your scheduled time will incur elimination.
- Classes may not be run in the same sequence as listed in this prize list.
- It is the competitors' responsibility to check the posted schedule of ride times for any changes. Ride times may be rescheduled due to unforeseen conflicts.
- Whips may be to a maximum length of 1.20m (1.00m for ponies)
- Test callers are permitted as per EC/FEI rules and are required to have appropriate dress.
- The competition will not provide a gate keeper. If one is desired, it is the responsibility of the rider to arrange for someone to close the gate for the entire class.
- Competition rings are sand footing. All tests are in a 20 x 60 m ring unless specified with entry form.

CANCELLATIONS & REFUNDS

- Cancellations received before the closing date will have a full refund.
- Cancellations received after the closing date and before the start of the show will forfeit their entries except where a certificate of disability from a qualified veterinarian or physician is presented to the office before the start of classes. A fee of \$25.00 will be charged on all cancellations.
- After the start of the show, a horse which has shown in one or more classes is eligible for a refund of 50% of the remaining class entry fees providing a veterinary or medical certificate is presented to the office prior to the end of the show. Stabling fees, administration fees, paramedic fees and EC drug testing fees will not be refunded.

VACCINATIONS:

ARTICLE A519 VACCINATIONS

"All horses attending Equestrian Canada sanctioned competitions must have been administered Equine Influenza and Equine Herpes Virus (1&4) vaccinations within 6 months (+21 days grace period) before arrival at the event. No horse shall receive vaccination within 7 days prior to arrival at the event. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be asked to leave the event site at the discretion of Competition Management.

The frequency of vaccine administration should be as recommended by the vaccine manufacturer or veterinarian. It is recommended that vaccines be administered by or under the direction of a veterinarian. Competition management may request supporting documentation confirming a horse's compliance with mandatory vaccination requirements.

In the case of a horse that is unable to receive either of the vaccines, a letter from a veterinarian on official letterhead must be provided with the entry form, stating the horse cannot be vaccinated due to medical concerns. At the discretion of competition management, a log of the horse's temperature prior to arrival at the event site or during the event can be requested."
