SHOW INFORMATION: THE CURRENT HCBC RULE BOOK WILL BE IN EFFECT

- Current year HCBC memberships are required.
- Horse recording and valid horse activation are not required.
- Any horse entered in any class at a competition may, be selected for equine medication control testing while at event location.
- All horses attending Vernon District Riding Club competitions must have met the requirements of Article A519, Vaccinations. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article A519, Vaccinations.
- Anyone mounted on a horse must wear ASTM/SEI or BSI/BS EN approved helmet, with safety harness correctly fastened, at all times while on the competition grounds.
- Only horses wearing a competition number are allowed on the grounds during the schooling and competition days.
- Competition numbers must be worn and visible at all times in the schooling and exercise areas as well as in the competition ring.
- Appropriate footwear must be worn when mounted.
- Junior riders must not ride or handle stallions anywhere on the competition grounds.
- Manageable stallions ridden by Seniors are eligible for all Senior classes.
- Decisions as to the manageability of stallions are at the discretion of the judge or steward. Unmanageable stallions must be excused from the ring and/or warm-up ring.
- Any contestant demonstrating unsafe or unsportsmanlike behaviour will be disqualified for the remainder of the show without refund of entry fees.
- Dogs must be kept on leashes at all times.
- No tack stalls are available.
- Longeing is permitted in the upper sand ring warm up area until half an hour before the show begins each day. The round pen is available for longeing at all times.
- Take practice fences so that the red flag is on your right.
- An adult must be present when a junior rider is jumping in the warm up ring.
- The management reserves the right to limit entries, or refuse an entry.
- The management reserves the right to cancel, combine, or split classes depending on the number of entries received.
- The management reserves the right to decide any point not covered in the rules and correct any error or omission in the program.
- Protests or objections will be handled by the management.
- The Show Office opens at 8:00 am on Friday, July 26, 2024 and one half hour prior to the start of classes on Friday, Saturday and Sunday.
- Classes at the same height will be run on an open card.
- Riders may ride a maximum of three horses per class.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- Individuals are considered juniors (Jr.) until the end of the calendar year in which they turn 18 years of age.
- A non-pro rider is a senior competitor who does not receive remuneration for riding/showing other people's horses, is not an NCCP fully certified high performance coach, and is not currently on the short list for the Canadian Team.
- Where 'no cross entries are allowed', this refers to one specific horse/rider combination

CANCELLATIONS, SUBSTITUTIONS & REFUNDS

- Cancellations received before the closing date of July 15, 2024 will have a full refund.
- Cancellations received after the closing date will forfeit their entries except where a certificate of disability from a qualified veterinarian or physician is presented to the office before the start of classes. A fee of \$25.00 or 15% of the entry (whichever is greater) will be charged on all cancellations.
- Substitutions will be permitted for a fee of \$25.00 per entry.
- After the start of the show, a horse which has shown in one or more classes is eligible for a refund of 50% of the remaining class entry fees providing a veterinary or medical certificate is presented to the office prior to the end of the show. Stabling fees, administration fees, paramedic fees and EC drug testing fees will not be refunded.
- For horses entered prior to the closing date, there will be no charge for changes (add/scratch). For same day changes, a fee of \$10.00 per day will apply. **An open cheque or credit card details must be presented to the office before any changes can be processed.** All changes must be made by 5:00 pm for the following day.
- All entries received after the closing date (late entries) are subject to a \$25.00 fee.
- **Trainers can only pre-book stalls with a completed entry form and fees paid per horse, and/or a \$120 deposit per horse, non-refundable after the closing date. STABLING FEES WILL NOT BE REFUNDED.**
- There will be no refunds or payouts for balance of \$10 or less.

PARKING AND CAMPING

Parking:

- Will be under the direction of Show Management; please co-operate with the volunteers who co-ordinate parking
- Horse trailers have priority for parking in close proximity to the stalls as there are no tack stalls. Do not park vehicles or put up tents, shelters or canopies in an area where a horse trailer would otherwise be able to park in front of stalls.
- We are short of parking space, so please be considerate of others and park your vehicles as directed.

Camping:

- Will be in Dr. Demetrick's back field, located behind the VDRC stall banks. Please be respectful of the property. Anyone found harassing wild life, domestic animals, other campers, disturbing the creek, or damaging the property WILL lose their camping privileges.
- No open fires; please collect all garbage and leave no trace.

PRIZES AND AWARDS:

- Rosettes to 6th place & Division Championship Awards
- Prize money distribution: 1st - 40%, 2nd - 30%, 3rd -20%, 4th - 10%
- Prize money will be mailed within 10 days of the show to the rider or owner as indicated on the entry form.

CONCIERGE STALL SERVICE:

A \$40 stall deposit is required for each stall or paddock. The deposit will be refunded at the conclusion of the show once the stall/paddock is stripped.

PHOTOGRAPHY:

Parents, riders, coaches and friends are welcome to take their own amateur photographs.

FOOD SERVICES:

A small cantina will be available on Friday (Schooling Day). A full concession will be provided Saturday & Sunday.

Baby Green Hunter, 2'6" (0.75 m), open to all horses in their first year of showing, no cross entry into any class over 2'9" (0.85 m).

Modified Child/Adult/Non-Pro Hunter, 2'9" (0.85 m), open to Junior/Amateur riders, horses not restricted.

53. IDC Beginner Hunter Medal - 2'3"

Open to junior and amateur riders, no rider cross entry into any Hunter or Hunter Equitation Class or Division over 2'6" (0.75 m), or any Jumper Classes over 0.75 m (Entry fee: \$25.00)

54. IDC PeeWee Jumper Medal - 0.75 m (Supported by Pheasant Run)

Open to junior and amateur riders, maximum height .75 m. No cross entry with the IDC Micro Medal or IDC Mini Medal. To be judged as an equitation class. The top 8 riders may be asked to compete in a ride off following the over fences portion. (Entry fee: \$30.00)

55. IDC Micro Medal - 0.85 m (Supported by Abigail Equestrian)

Open to junior and amateur riders, maximum height .85 m. No cross entry with the IDC PeeWee Medal or IDC Mini Medal. To be judged as an equitation class. The top 8 riders may be asked to compete in a ride off following the over fences portion. (Entry fee: \$30.00)

56. IDC Mini Medal - 1.0 m (Supported by Hunter Hill Farm)

Open to junior and amateur riders, maximum height 1.0 m. No cross entry with the IDC PeeWee Medal or IDC Micro Medal. To be judged as an equitation class. The top 8 riders may be asked to compete in a ride off following the over fences portion. (Entry fee: \$30.00)

57. \$300 VDRC Hunter Derby - 2'6, 2'9, 3'0

Open to all. Must have shown in at least one Hunter or Jumper division. To be ridden at 2'6 (0.75 m), 2'9 (0.85 m), or 3' (0.9 m). Height to be declared at time of entry and to be judged as one class. (Entry fee \$40.00)

JUMPERS

To be run under FEI Article 236 Table A, FEI Article 238 2.1 and 2.2 and FEI Article 274

Table A 2.1. Competitors with equality of penalties for any place are placed in accordance with the time taken to complete the round. In the event of equality of penalties and time for first place, there may be a jump-off over a shortened course over obstacles, which may be increased in height and/or spread in accordance with the provisions of the schedule.

Table A 2.2. A competition against the clock, but in the event of equality of penalties for first place, there will be one jump-off against the clock. Other competitors are placed according to their penalties and time in the first round. For minor competitions the jump-off may be run according to table C, if thus provided in the schedule.

FEI Article 274: Competition in Two Phases (Power & Speed). This competition comprises two phases run without interruption, the finishing line for the 1st phase (7 to 9 obstacles) being identical with the starting line for the second phase (4 to 6 obstacles).

Hors concours entries are permitted but are subject to the same rules as a regular entry. Hors concours entries may not participate in a jump-off, may not be judged in and may compete only once in the same ring on the same day.

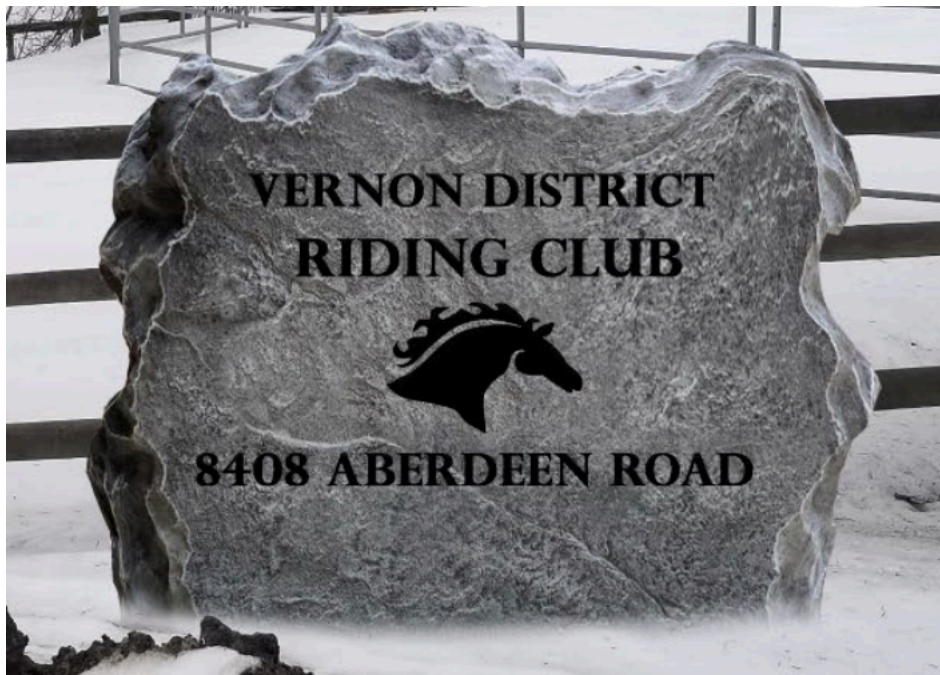
