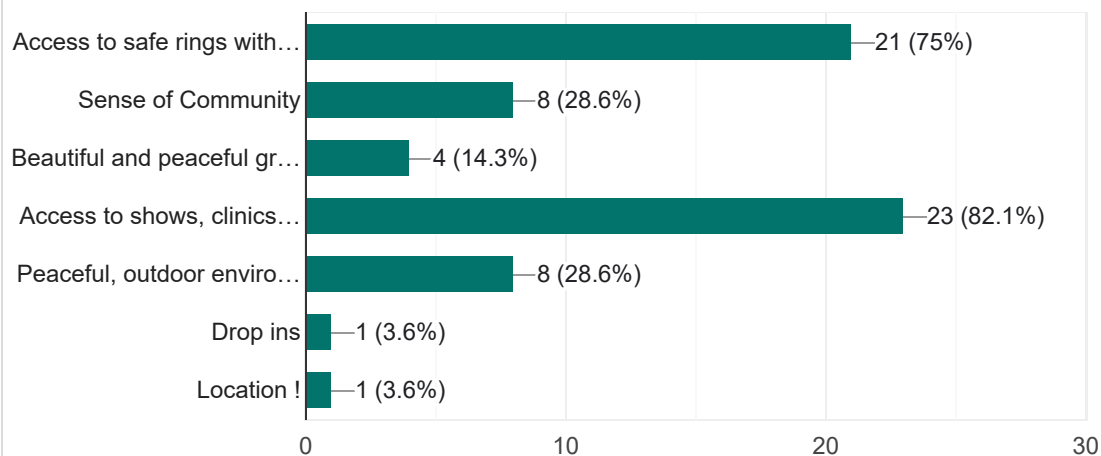

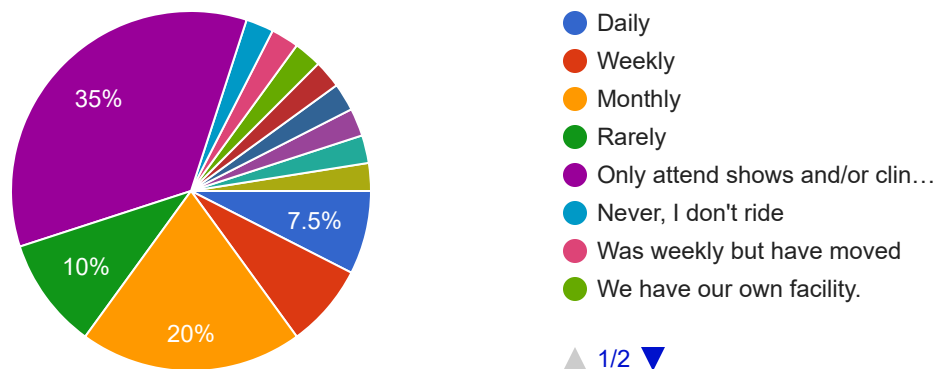

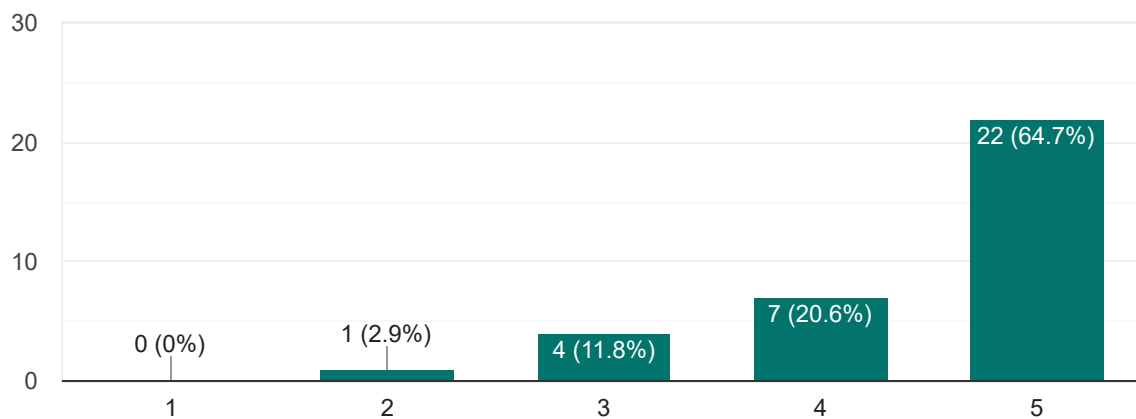

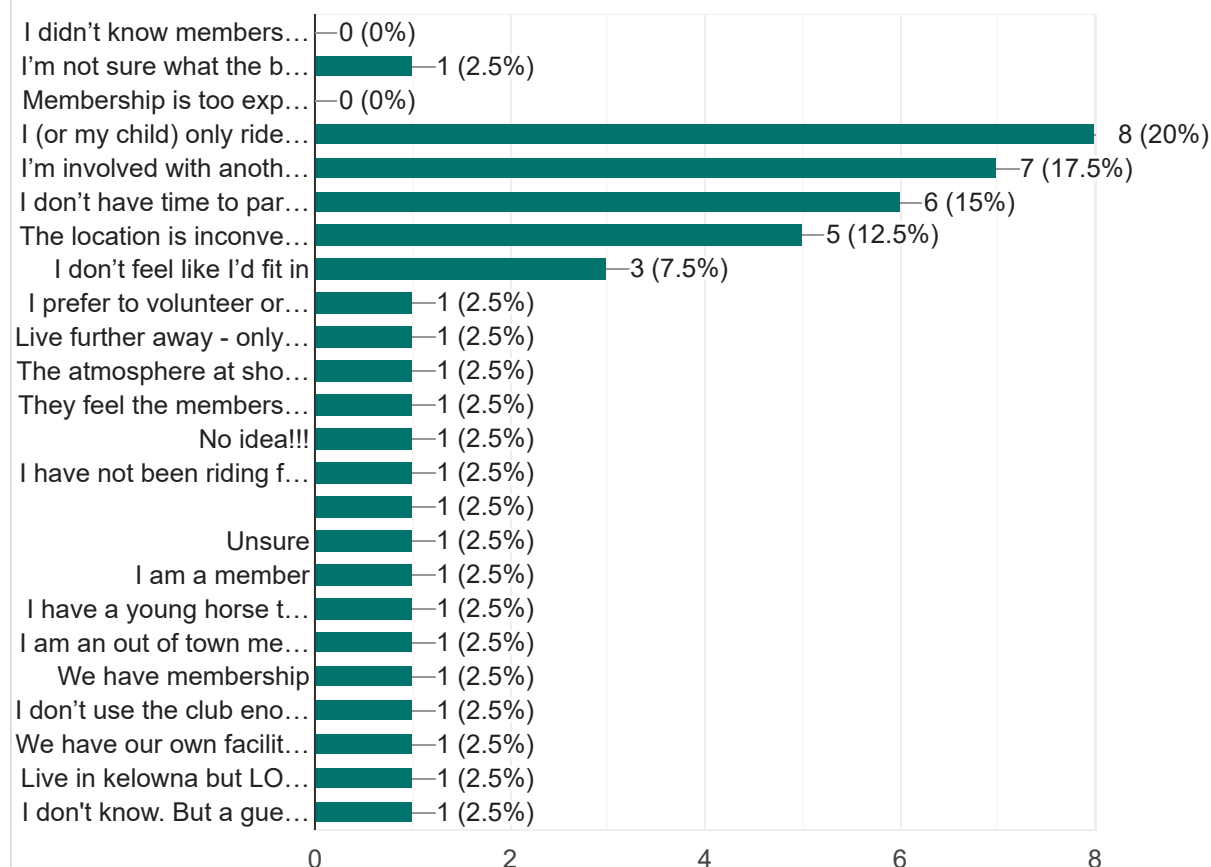
How welcoming and inclusive do you find events at the facility?

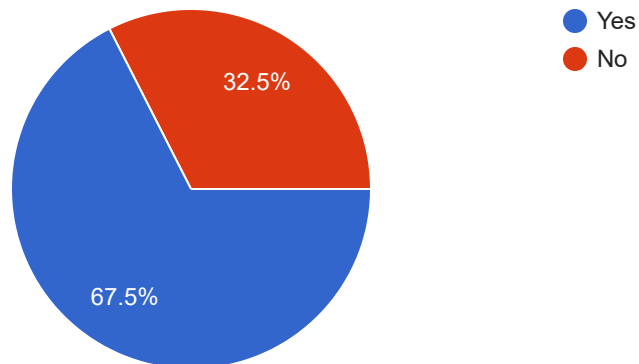

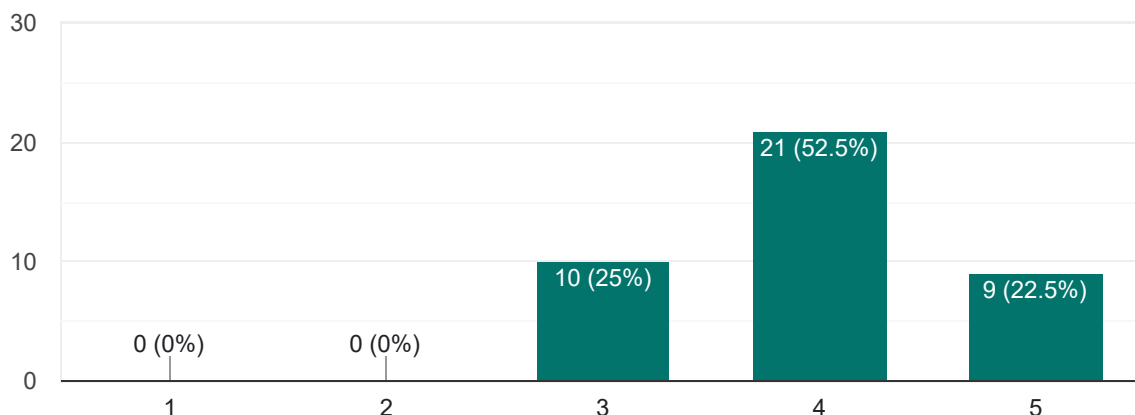

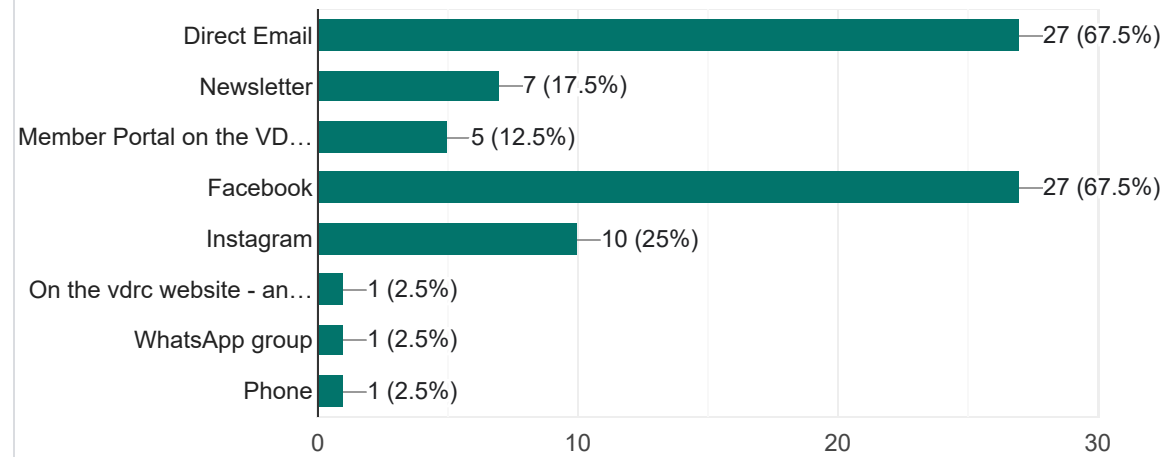

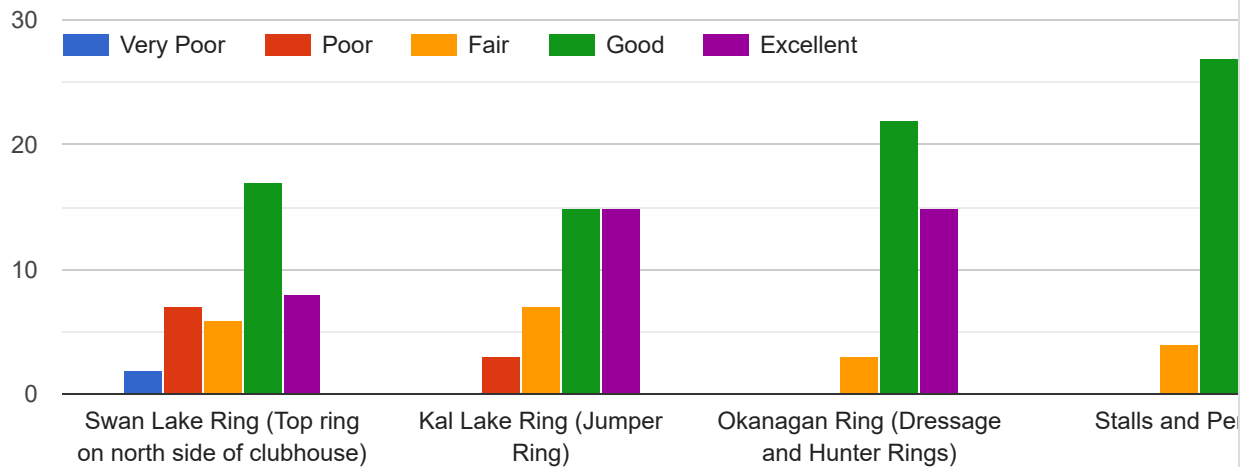

Adding showers to the clubhouse or an outbuilding in future renovation plans would be well-received by many of us who stay onsite for 3-4 day shows/clinics.

Better footing in the round pen for lungeing; it very slick in the spring.

Adding mesh/wire fencing around the perimeter to keep neighbour dogs out would be lovely. As stated above, dogs enter rings without handlers way too often and it is a safety issue. (Dogs from neighbouring properties being the worst and will get somebody hurt one day).

The watering of the jumper ring (overwatered during rainy days). Water pools into ring

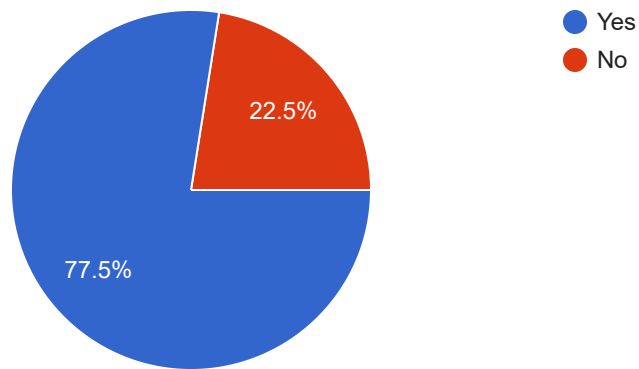

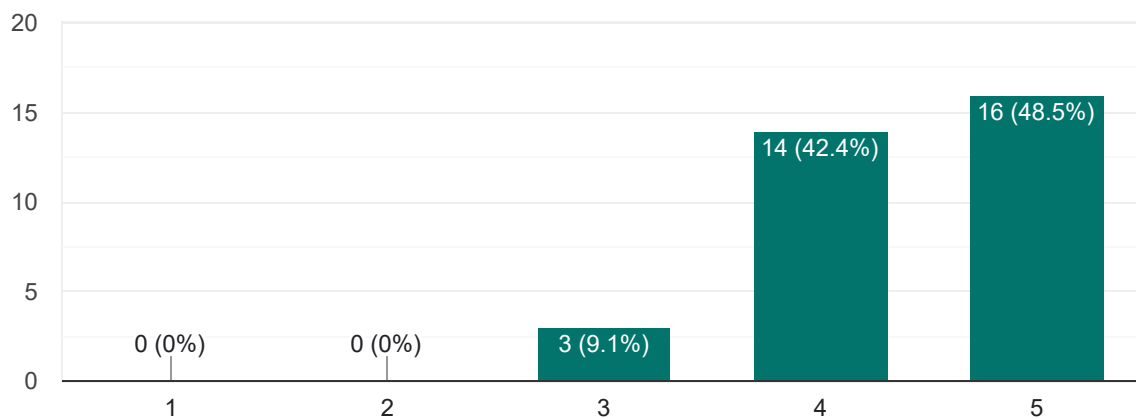
Have you participated or attended any horse shows hosted by VDRC this year?

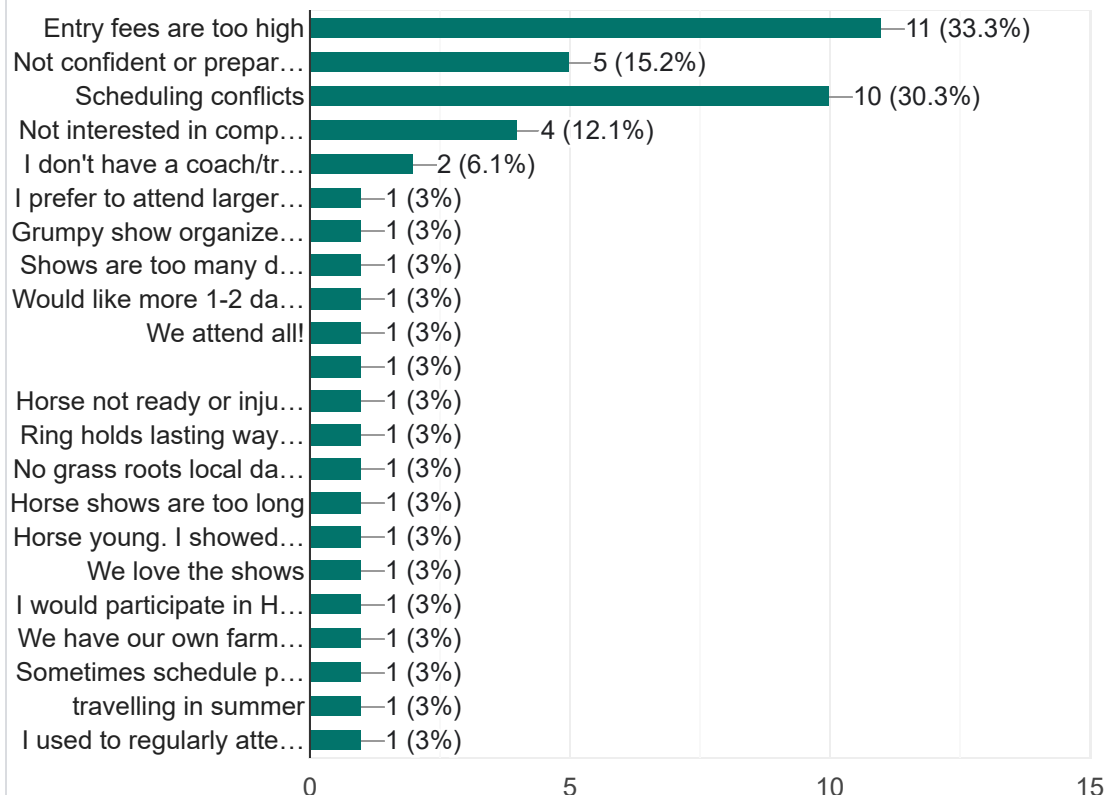

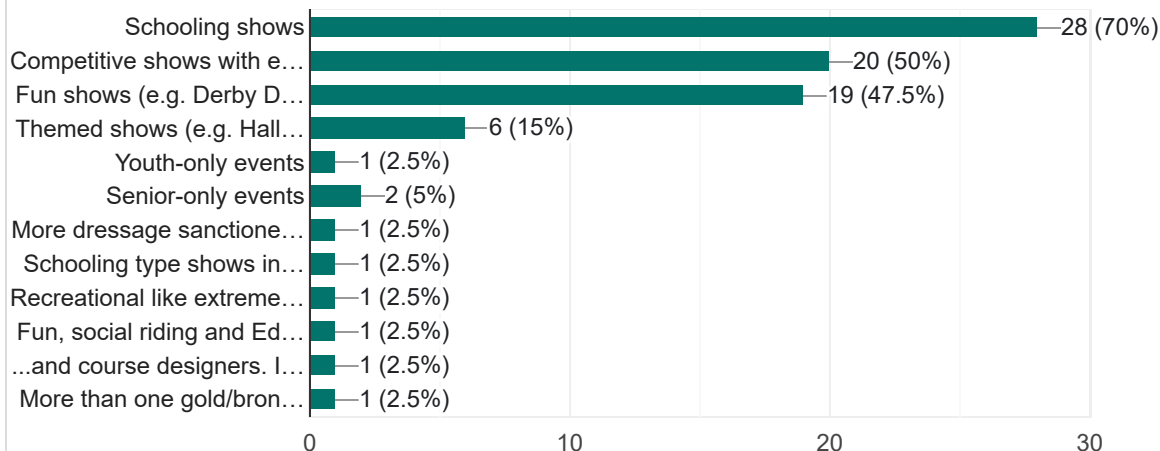

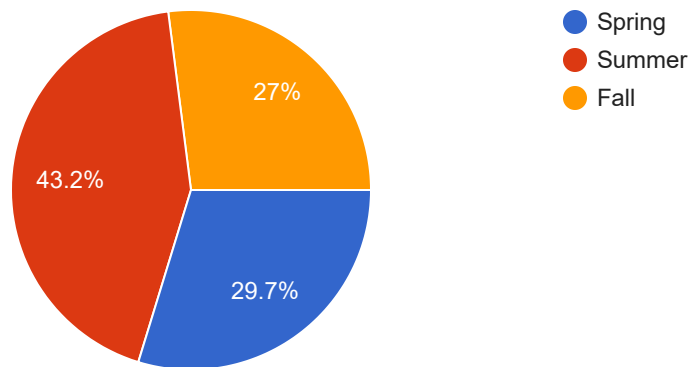

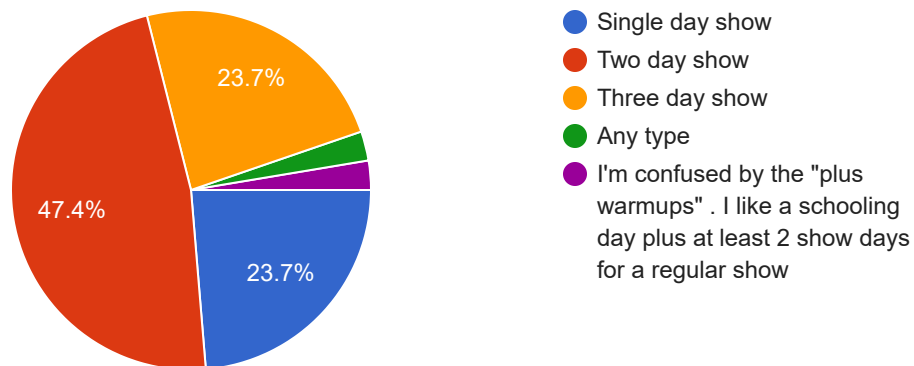

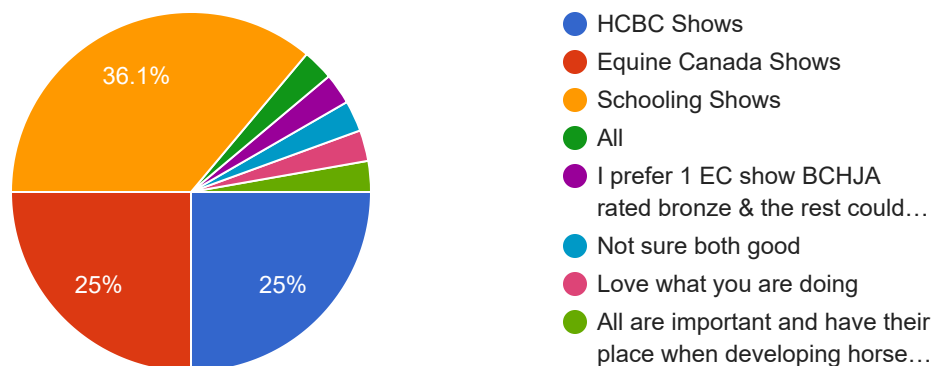

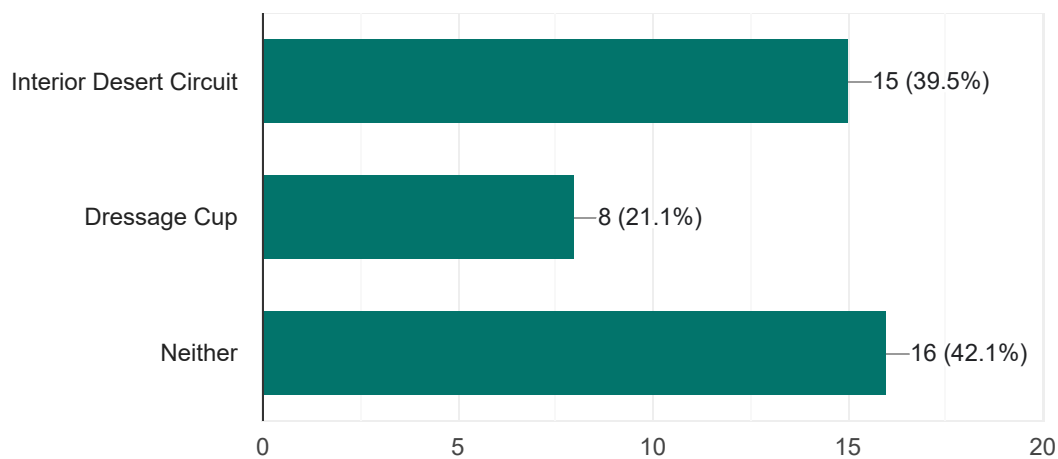

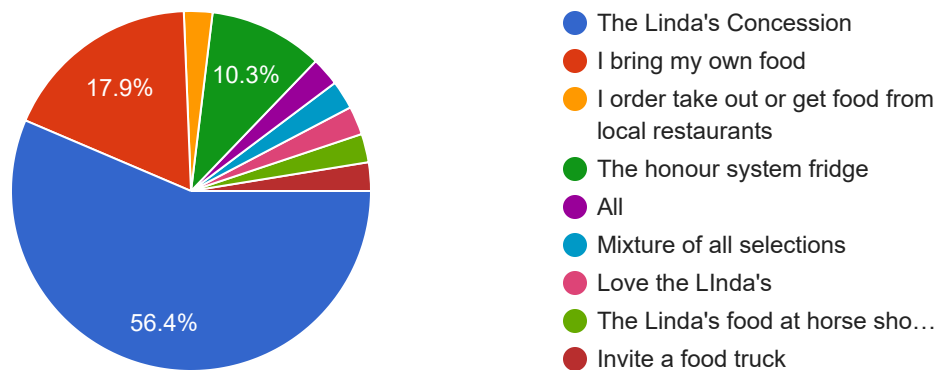

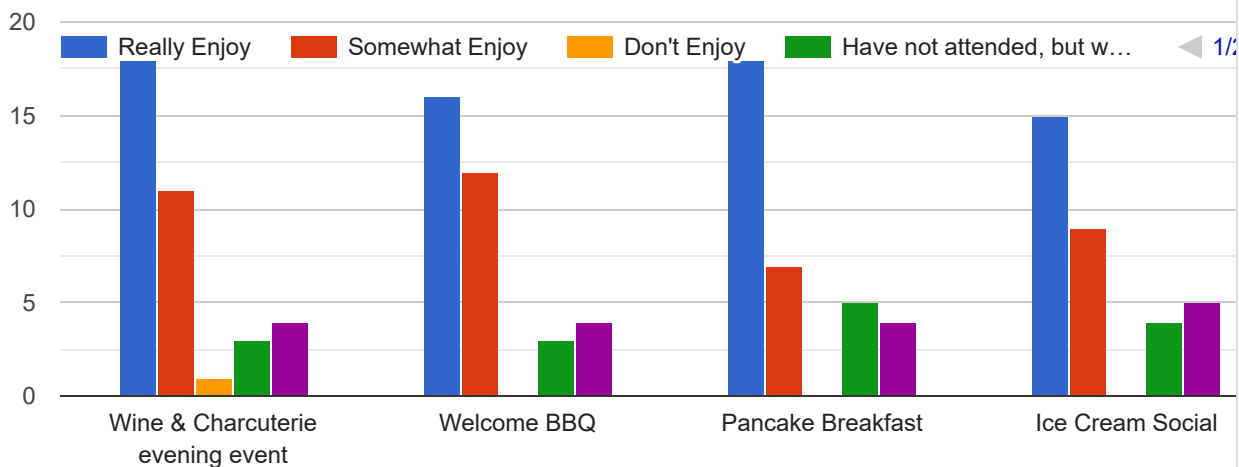

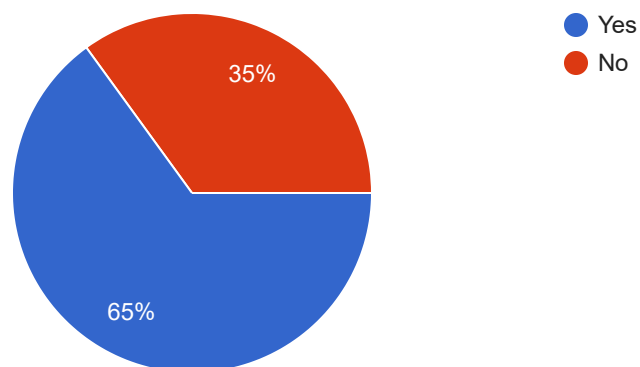

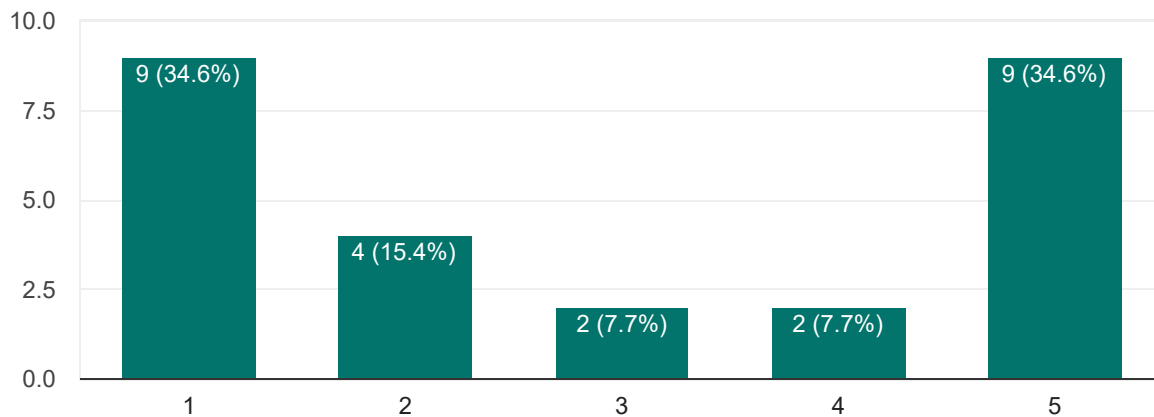

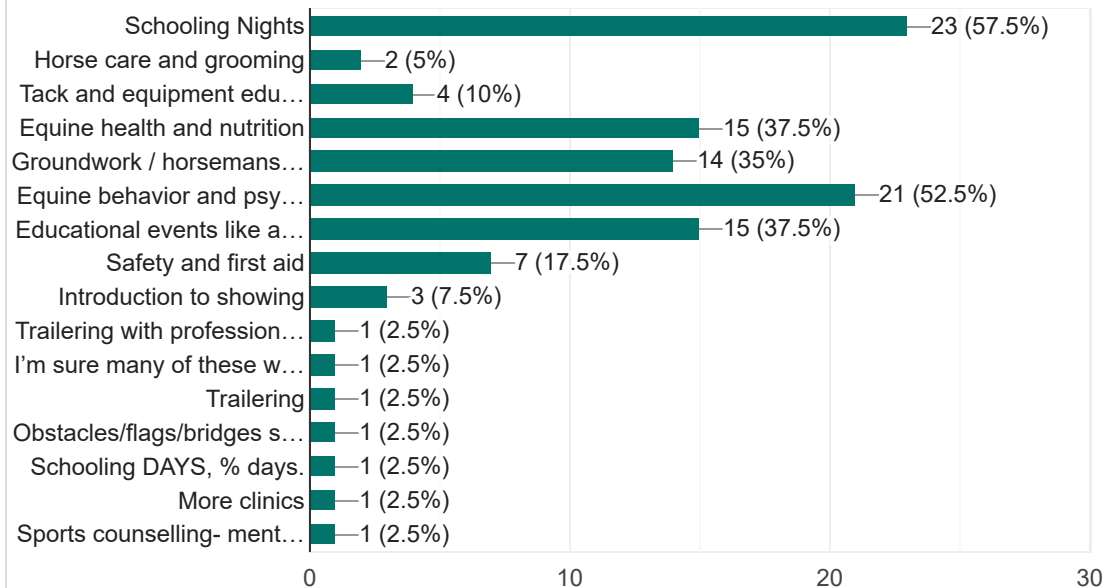

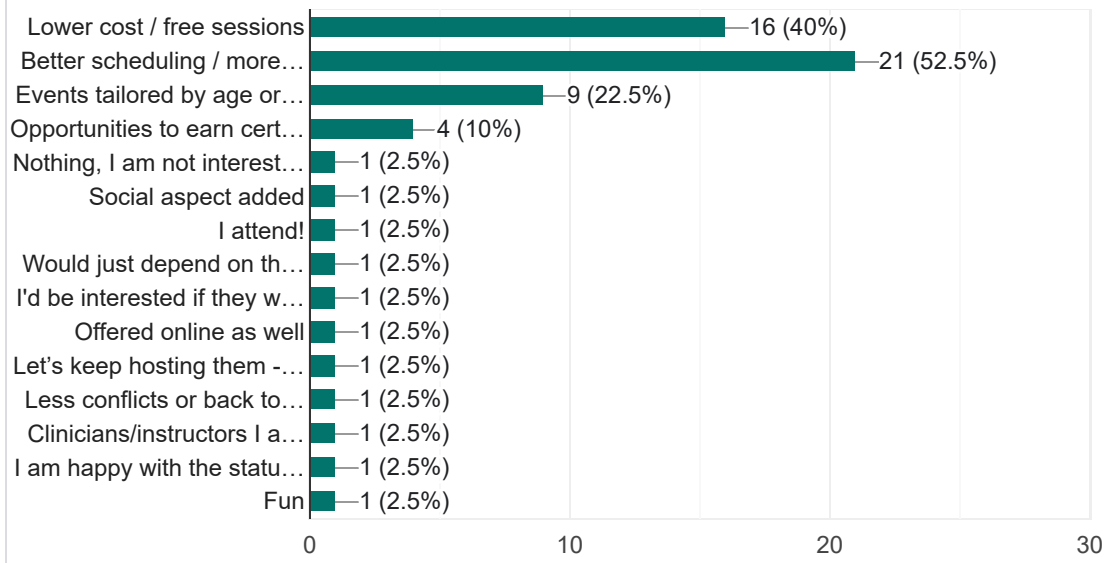

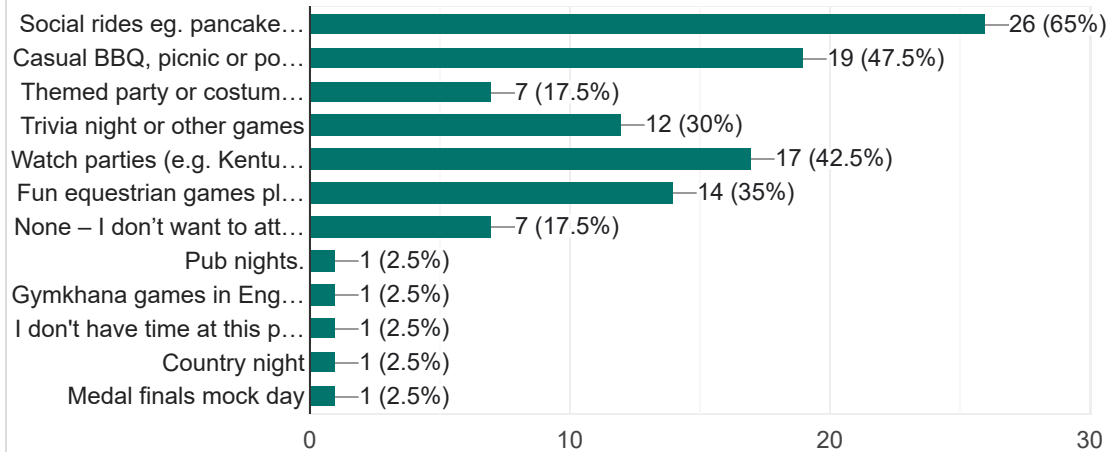

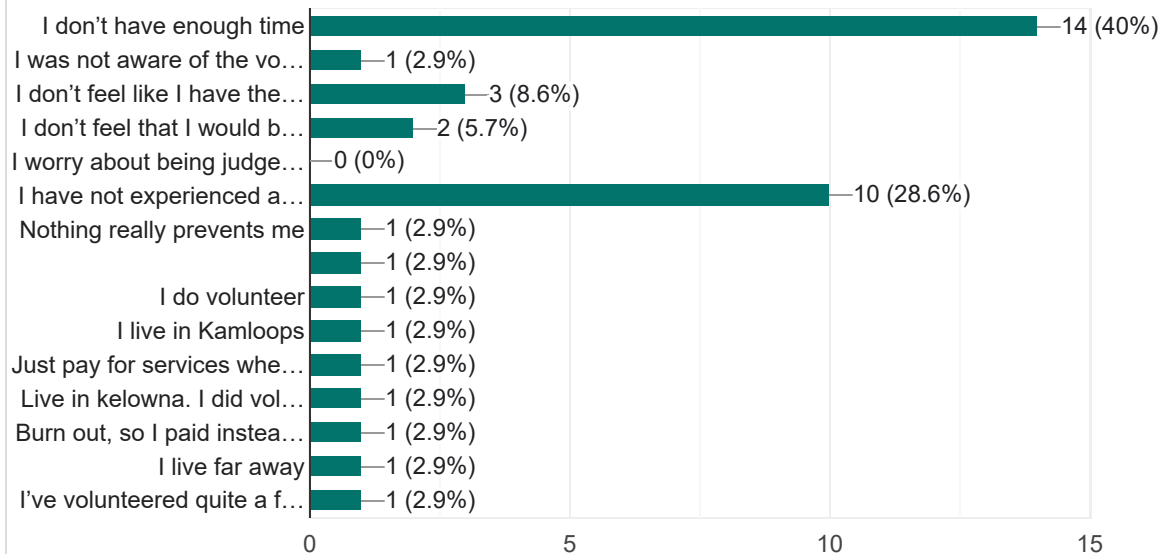

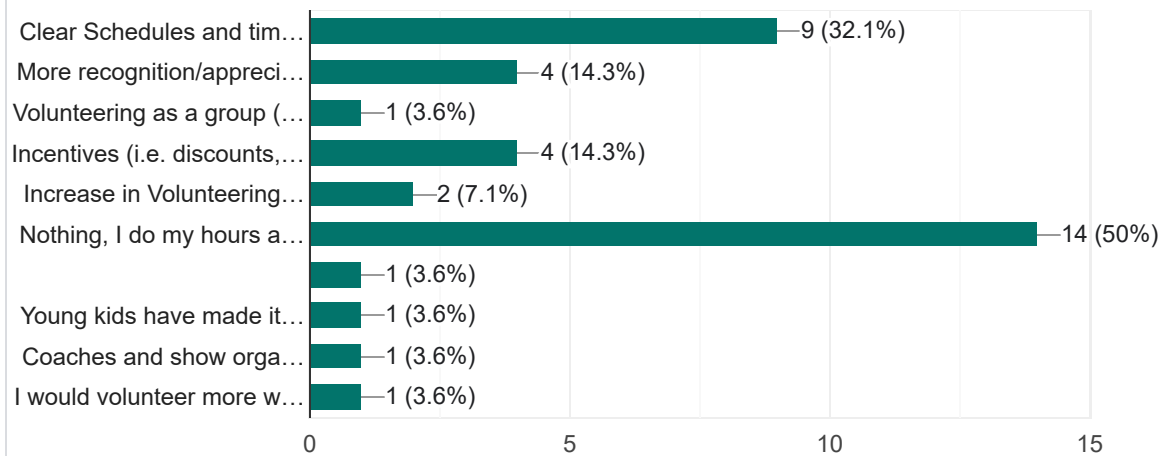

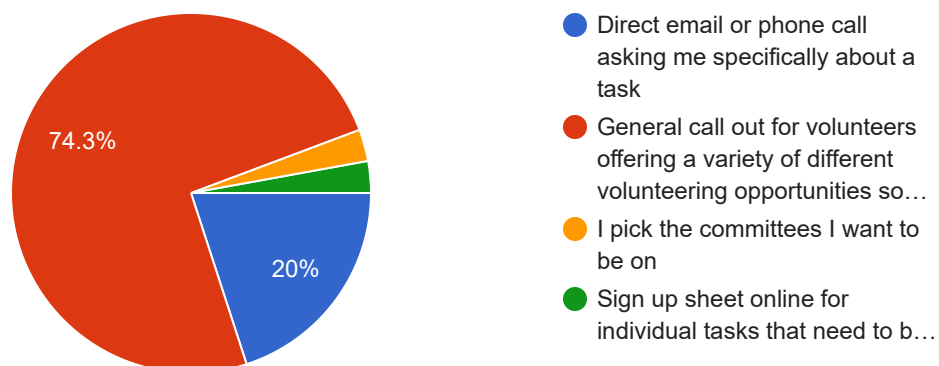
What would make you more likely to volunteer?

Footing in the rings. I understand the cost and undertaking is enormous (I in no way expect it to be redone) and that many likely would not agree on what would be best footing to use but the footing is boarder line dangerous. Between soft spots and pitty holes , concrete, uneven depth of sand, base coming up.

I would not jump my personal horses on the footing and am hesitant to have my riders jump more the .85.

The drag looks like it is not adjusted properly, the tines should not be digging into the base as they are pulling it up, you can clearly see the base coming up, all the pebbles and rocks are base. This is making replacing the footing a much larger and more expensive project as the base will need to be redone as well, it is almost causing pot holes. You might not see them but you can feel them. The tines should not touch the base and should not be deeper then the leveling blade. The level also looks like it may be lopsided as it will dig into on the side through turns as well.

Whoever is dragging the ring needs to be extremely particular about how it is set and needs to take the time to adjust it accordingly.

Keeping the VDRC going!

I would like the Swan Lake Ring available to all for schooling in the morning at the H/J shows. It is too busy to have all of the green riders and horses forced into the Okanagan schooling. Management said they did it that way so that the kids riding in the baby ring (Swan Lake) weren't riding in the heat of the afternoon. But Swan Lake gets shade in the afternoon so that is less of a factor than having a serious injury in an over crowded warm up (Okanagan) with horses and riders that may or may not be under control. I would also like to do away with the Swan Lake "warm up" area. The show ring was too small to build a safe course for all as the ends were too tight and the lines were too short. I think having an area for collecting and learning the course is great but it could be smaller. Riders entered in that ring should be allowed to warm up in the show ring for an hour or so prior to the class. That way they aren't forced to go in the main warm up or forced to careen around a shoebox. If riders/coaches feel like a warm up jump is necessary before they are to be judged they should be allowed to school over jumps in the show ring. These shows are suppose to be friendly and inviting for green riders and green horses. I didn't find the August Swan Lake format to be either of those things...and I was not the only one.

You guys are amazing! Thank you for your commitment to our little gem of a club.

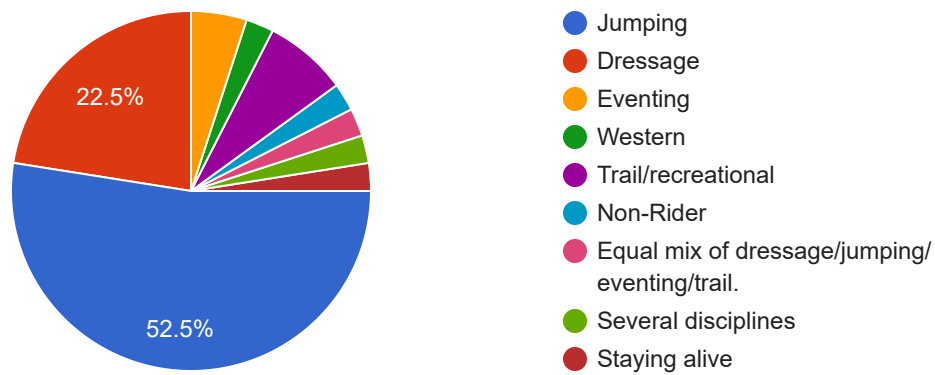
