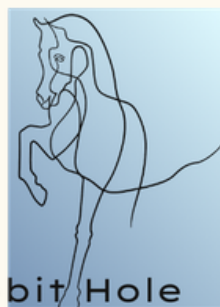

VDRRC VACCINATIONS: EC RULE A519 VACCINATIONS

“All horse entered in any class at a competition must have met the requirements of Article A519, Vaccinations. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article A519, Vaccinations.” (rule A602.8)

All horses attending Equestrian Canada sanctioned competitions must have been administered Equine Influenza and Equine Herpes Virus (1&4) vaccinations within 6 months (+21 days grace period) before arrival at the event. No horse shall receive vaccination within 7 days prior to arrival at the event. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be asked to leave the event site at the discretion of Competition Management.

All proof of Vaccines (Vet Certificate or Invoice) must contain horse's registered/show name and be attached to entries as a pdf form

JR and SR Waivers and Vaccination forms are found on the VDRRC website under Shows and Clinics. Please fill and attach to your entry as a pdf

GENERAL SHOW INFORMATION

RIDE TIMES:

Scheduled ride times will be available on the Fox Village website by May 21, 2026. As well these ride times will be emailed out to competitors to the email address on the entry form provided. Daily order of go will supersede all previous schedules. Day sheets will be posted in the club house and the warm up ring. Scratches may not reach the Fox Village site during the competition. While the show will make every effort to adhere to the ride times published on Fox Village, short notice changes may occur.

ORDER OF GO SCHEDULE:

- start times daily will be confirmed and dependent on entries
- signs and site maps for ring locations will be at the clubhouse
- a one hour break will occur at approximately noon each day for watering and grooming rings as necessary
- Swan Lake ring is the designated warm-up ring - lunging will be permitted in this ring only between 6-7 am only
- No warm-up is allowed in the designated show rings on the days of competition. Okanagan Lake ring will be available for use Thursday and Friday. Okanagan Lake also an alternate show ring and may be used as determined by the show committee.

CONCESSION:

Linda'sCafe will be open during the show for food and beverages. Purchases from the concession help support the Vernon Riding Club.

SHOW OFFICE:

The show office is located inside of the Club House. The Show office will be open at the following times: Friday from 3:30 pm , Saturday and Sunday one hour before first scheduled ride to half hour after the last ride.

EC SPORT LICENSING 2026

SAFETY, INCLUSIVITY, & EXCELLENCE

Your guide to the latest updates for the competition season in Canada

IMPORTANT CHANGES have been implemented to enhance the safety and inclusivity of equestrian sport. Whether you're an athlete, parent, coach, official, or competition staff, your role is crucial in upholding these standards. Here's what you need to know:

SAFE SPORT TRAINING PREREQUISITE:

- The two free EC Safe Sport training modules must be completed before purchasing a Sport Licence. Check your training status on MyEC by clicking on the ECampus button.

DISCONTINUED TEMPORARY LICENCES AND TEMPORARY HORSE REGISTRATIONS:

- Temporary EC Sport Licences are now discontinued at competitions. All riders, owners, and coaches must possess an EC Sport Licence to participate in events. All horses must have a Horse Recording where level and division require.

AVAILABLE SHOW LEVEL UPGRADES:

- Explore higher-level competitions with temporary upgrades via your MyEC Portal. Note: National Rankings Points are not tabulated for upgraded results.

COACH STATUS REMINDER—2026 SEASON

- Coaches attending EC-Sanctioned competition must hold a valid Licensed Coach Status. Any Coach with Registered Coach Status must purchase a Single Event Upgrade for \$55.00. This purchase can be made through the My EC account.
- Coaches without a valid Licensed Coach Status or Registered Coach Status with Single Event Upgrade Status are not eligible to be represented as a coach at EC-Sanctioned events and may be subject to fines. Please complete your requirements in advance to avoid any fines and delays.

DECLARE YOURSELF A SELF-COACHED ATHLETE

- Athletes without a coach on-site can declare themselves as self-coached by entering their own **EC SPORT LICENSE NUMBER** or enter "self-coached" in the **COACH FIELD** on their registration/entry form.
- Please note: Coaches that **DO NOT ATTEND** the events **SHOULD NOT BE LISTED** on the entry form.



"When registering for EC

sanctioned competitions, the name of their coach on the entry form or specify that they are self-coached. Coaches from other countries, must be in good-standing with their home federation and must declare/have proof of insurance. The Vernon District Riding Club (VDRC) Dressage Show, A Celebration of Dressage is sanctioned as a GOLD and BRONZE competition of Equestrian Canada c/o House of Sport 2451 Riverside Drive, Ottawa, Ontario, K1H 7X7 and is governed by the rules of EC. (rule A602.1) “Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of EC and will be held and judged in accordance with the EC Rule Book.” (rule A602.2)

“Per Article A801, every entry at an EC-sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider and horse shall be subject to the EC constitution and all rules of EC and any additional rules set by the competition. It is the responsibility of all individuals participating in any capacity in EC-sanctioned competitions to be knowledgeable regarding the EC constitution and the applicable rules of EC and the additional rules, if any, imposed by the competition. Do not participate in this EC- sanctioned competition in any capacity if you do not consent to be bound by the constitution and rules of EC and any additional rules imposed by the competition” (rule A602.7)

It is the responsibility of all individuals participating in any capacity in EC-sanctioned competitions to be knowledgeable regarding the EC constitution and the applicable rules of EC and the additional rules, if any, imposed by the competition.

Statement of Principles – Horse Welfare

EC requires adherence to humane treatment of horses in all activities under its jurisdiction.

All participants shall be bound by the Horse Welfare Code of Conduct.

EC is committed to:

- upholding the welfare of the horse, regardless of monetary value, as a primary consideration in all activities.
- requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect, and the compassion that they deserve, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment.
- ensuring that owners, trainers, and exhibitors and their agents exercise appropriate care and responsibility in the handling, treatment, and transportation of their horses, as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose.
- providing for the continuous wellbeing of the horse by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort, and safety.
- continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare.
- requiring owners, trainers, and exhibitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization’s rules, and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competitions; and,
- reviewing, revising, and developing competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of the horse.

In determining whether conduct or treatment is cruel, abusive or inhumane, the standard to be applied will be the conduct or treatment expected of a reasonable person who is informed and experienced in equine training and exhibition procedures. EC Gold/Bronze Sanctioned Competition May 24 & 25, 2025.



RISK: BIOSECURITY

1. IDENTIFICATION OF POTENTIAL RISK (IN AND OUT OF OUR CONTROLS)

The VDRC hosts horse shows, clinics and other riding events which the stresses on the horse from travel, stall confinement, and/or a new environment can make the horse more susceptible to disease.

Shows bring horses from different locations, backgrounds and vaccination histories to one location, resulting in increased potential for interaction between horses, thus increasing the risk of disease spread.

2. PREVENTION OF RISK

As of 2023, the VDRC requires all horses coming to the VDRC grounds to have documented proof of up to date vaccinations from a veterinarian.

Ensure proper cleaning of stalls before and after use since bacteria, viruses and parasites can remain viable and able to spread in manure, shavings or other stall material.

Manure pile is located in a confined area away from regular traffic to avoid spread of contaminants.

VDRC EMERGENCY PLAN

1) NOTIFY:

The horse owner, person responsible, event manager, groundskeeper, and veterinarian must be notified of the sick horse.

2) SEPARATE:

An area of isolation on site of the VDRC will be designated for the sick horse to limit contact with other horses, dogs, and humans. Proper barrier and disinfectant practices must be followed by the individual handling the horse, and on any equipment/items used with the sick horse.

VDRC EMERGENCY PLAN cont'd

3) OBTAIN A DIAGNOSIS:

A veterinarian must examine and diagnose the sick horse to identify the nature of the disease and if it can be spread.

4) RESPOND AND COMMUNICATE:

Alert other competitors of the sick horse and its diagnosis (once determined). It is important to minimize panic and overreaction to limit any hasty actions and further disease spread. Notice of the sick horse must be communicated accurately.

5) IDENTIFY EXPOSED HORSES:

Must identify horses that were in direct contact (physically touched) and indirect contact (shared water, shared equipment, adjacent stall) with the sick horse.

A direct excerpt from the National Farm and Facility Level Biosecurity User Guide for the Equine Sector; “In general, horses with direct contact are high-risk animals, horses with indirect contact are medium-risk animals, and horses with no known direct or indirect contact can be considered low-risk animals for infection and spread of disease. Knowledge of the disease is important to identify potentially high-risk horses.”

6) RESTRICT MOVEMENT:

Until a veterinarian diagnosis, restrict movement of any potentially exposed horses on or off the property. For the horses already on property, depending on the diagnosis, medium and low risk exposed horses may continue in competition.

7) MONITOR HORSES:

Monitor and care for the sick horse as instructed by the veterinarian. Other horse owners on the property should monitor their horses for symptoms.

8) RELEASE HORSES:

Before any movement of horses, a veterinarian should be consulted. Once approved, the sick horse or potentially infected horses may be transported home in isolation from other non infected horses, back to their home barn. Provide information for all horse owners leaving the facility on the disease and symptoms to watch out for.

RISING STARS YOUTH DRESSAGE 2026

The Rising Stars Equitation Program was developed and continues to be overseen by the Rising Stars Youth Dressage Committee established in 2004 in Chilliwack, British Columbia. In 2019, the Rising Stars Equitation program was recognized by Equestrian Canada as a Dressage Youth Development program.

OBJECTIVE of Rising Stars: “To assist in the development, in the improvement and in the continuing advancement of the equitation skills required by Youth Dressage riders by providing an ongoing evaluation of their equitation skills during the performance of a technical dressage test.”

A Dressage Equitation Judge will use the *Rising Stars Youth Dressage Equitation Score Sheet to evaluate the rider based solely on rider skills during a technical dressage test. The Rising Stars Equitation Program is for all Youth Dressage Riders, up to and including 25 years of age.

Rising Stars will be offered for all levels, the rider must enter Test 2 of that level on the Sunday to qualify for the RS championship.

AWARDS AND CHAMPIONSHIPS

SHOW CHAMPION AND RESERVE CHAMPION:

The equitation score to determine placings. Award and Championship presentation will take place Sunday during the Lunch break. **Riders should be dressed and mounted or in hand for the awards presentation.**

RISING STARS PROVINCIAL CHAMPION/RESERVE CHAMPION:

Champion and Reserve Champions established at each competition, will have qualified to compete in their Provincial or Regional Championship for a Provincial or Regional ‘Ride Off’.

Fox Village Online Entry 101

What do you need to have ready before completing your online entry?

Sign onto www.entry.foxvillage.com to create your profile for future entries

1. Make sure you have your EC and HCBC membership numbers. You will need a minimum of an EC Bronze license to enter. If you are wanting to collect scores to qualify for National Dressage Championships, you will need an EC Gold license and a horse license number to compete in the Gold division.
2. Have your horse owner's EC and HCBC membership numbers.
3. Have proof of your horse's vaccinations (PDF or JPEG file for upload containing registered/show name). All horses attending EC sanctioned competitions must have been administered Equine Influenza and Equine Herpes Virus (1 & 4) vaccinations within 6 months (+21 day grace period, but not less than 7 days) before arrival at the event.
4. Fill in and save a digital copy (pdf or jpeg file for upload) of the applicable VDRC waivers and entry signature page. These will also be available to complete and save to upload during the entry process.
5. Know the numbers of the classes you wish to enter. Hint in TOC box start typing the name of the test. Eg (Third Level)
6. Have your credit card information with you (Visa and MasterCard accepted).

IMPORTANT RULE CHANGE FROM EC

FEI RIDERS (YR, Medium and Large Tour **may only ride one test** per day including **Freestyle**)

Exceptions: 1: Apply if a horse is shared between a Para Grade I or II and a dressage rider. In these cases the horse may compete in up to 2 tests per day.

2: Young rider is allowed 1 technical test and 1 freestyle -2 test

Riders up to 2nd level may ride 3 tests/day including Freestyle (FEI Child/Pony YH 5. Para National and GrI ,II, JR,YH)

Riders up to 2nd level may ride 3x/day including Freestyle Exceptions. Freestyle (FEI Child/Pony YH5, Para National and Gr I

NO Horse May Go 4 times in a Day and may only be ridden in 2 consecutive Levels

General Rules & Regulations

TACK & DRESS:

Tack & Dress according to 2025 EC Section E Rules. Note: all riders to wear approved helmets when mounted at the event location (Article E 4.0 Safety Headgear).

See [Equestrian Canada Dressage Rules](#) for the 2025 Rulebook.

CLASSES:

Only Amateur and Junior riders may enter a bronze class. Amateur Status must be declared to EC. All open riders must enter a gold class with the exception of walk trot.

ADULTS:

Individuals are adults, or seniors, from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 19.

AMATEURS:

Adults eligible to compete in EC Amateur Classes as per EC Article A902. A person competing in EC amateur classes must hold a valid EC Sport License and have a current Amateur status.

COACHES:

Equestrian Coaches who have completed an evaluation and are certified by EC in partnership with the Coaching Association of Canada and hold a current coaching status with EC.

FEI AGE LIMITATIONS:

See Article E3.4.4, FEI Age Limitations

JUNIORS:

Individuals are Juniors until the end of the calendar year in which they turn 18.

PERSON RESPONSIBLE:

The Person Responsible (PR) for a horse must be an adult who has or shares responsibility for the care, training, custody, and performance of the horse, and who has official responsibility for that horse under EC Rules. The PR is liable under penalty provisions of the applicable EC Rules for any rule violations. Every entry form for an EC sanctioned competition must identify the PR and be signed by the PR. This definition was updated April 2018 [Person Responsible Rule](#). The Person Responsible must hold an EC Sport License.

General Rules & Regulations cont'd

LICENCE AND MEMBERSHIP:

2026 Bronze or Gold EC Sport Licenses are required by competitors, owners or lessees, and individuals accepting responsibility for entries in an EC sanctioned competition. Valid EC Horse Recording, 2026 EC Horse Activation are required for Gold competition.

Vaccination documentation required. Horse Council B.C. or Provincial equivalent or USEF required. Temporary licenses, bronze licenses and upgrades must be purchased through EC prior to your registration.

“Canadian entries are required to hold an EC Horse Recording and have paid the EC Horse Recording annual Activation Fee to compete. The exception is for horses in the Bronze show. If a Bronze license holder (both rider and owner) ever the Gold division they must apply for a single event upgrade in the EC website before the show.

FREESTYLES:

All Freestyles will **FOLLOW** the Division Classes on Saturday (**Approx** 3:00 but not guaranteed). Please provide your own music to the Show Secretary upon registration. If using a phone, please ensure you have someone able to operate it. Music/sound checks will be on Friday at 5 pm, or during lunch break on Saturday.

FREESTYLE ELIGIBILITY:

Freestyle riders in Gold and Bronze competition. Open to all EC and FEI freestyle levels A horse/rider combination must have obtained the following prior to competing in a freestyle: a minimum score of 60% in a technical dressage test at the same level, or higher. The dressage score may have been obtained at an EC Gold/Silver dressage competition prior to the competition or may be obtained at the same competition in which they wish to enter the freestyle. Article E 10.6.1 Technical scores earned at silver competitions count toward entering freestyle in a Gold competition and vice versa. Bronze competitions require no minimum technical score. A rider in the Bronze competition may enter a freestyle without having ridden the technical test. (e.g. competes in first level technical and second level freestyle).

WDAA WESTERN DRESSAGE:

These classes are considered miscellaneous classes under EC rules and are not eligible for EC awards. Western Dressage Riders are required to wear approved protective head gear HCBC Western Dressage tests are available upon request. Please specify which tests will be ridden on entry form The Show Committee reserves the right to alter or combine classes.

General Rules & Regulations cont'd

ROSETTES:

Rosettes to fourth (4th) place will be awarded at the completion of every class.

SCORING:

Points awarded by the judges are final.

Where there is only one rider in a class, percentages will be applied as follows:

1st place 63% or higher

2nd 60% - 62.9%

3rd 58% - 59.9%

Class Scores will be posted on the windows of the club house when the class is complete and scores are ready for posting.

TEST AND ROSETTES ACCEPTANCE LOCATION:

Tests and Rosettes may be picked up at the prize area in the club house on completion of each class/level and posting of results.

PRESENTATIONS FOR CHAMPIONSHIPS AND AWARDS:

Freestyle and Rising Stars Awards will be presented at the completion of the class and formal presentation at the Saturday Wine & Cheese. Rising Stars awards will be a mounted presentation. Riders should be prepared to present themselves in show attire, unmounted, at the club house area for award presentation and pictures. Pictures may include the horse at the show's discretion. The Show Committee reserves the right to alter, cancel or combine any awards.

A Championship and Reserve Championship will be presented in both the Bronze and Gold competition for each Division and Category with 4 or more entries. If there are fewer than 4 entries in a division a score of 63% or higher will be awarded a Championship or 60% for Reserve Champion. The Champion will be determined by the horse/rider combination with the highest combined percentages achieved in the 2 designated C classes at each level (E9.10.4). The designated classes are Test 2 on Saturday and Test 3 on Sunday at each level. These class names and numbers are labelled with a 'C' in the **CLASSES OFFERED**. In the event of a tie for the championship, the competitor with the highest single percentage score (test) is declared the winner. Any horse receiving less than 50% on a technical test will not receive an award as per Art. E 9.10.7. Each horse/rider combination up to and including 4th level **must enter 3 Classes over the course of the show** Freestyle classes do not qualify for championship calculations but are included in this requirement.

OTHER PRIZES

WDAA WESTERN DRESSAGE HIGH-SCORE

CHAMPION AND RESERVE FOR RISING STARS

FEI CHAMPION:

FEI Champion will be determined by the highest two combined technical scores earned over two days of FEI classes including Para. Open riders must ride the Intermediate 1 for the Small Tour Championship. Amateur riders may ride PSG on both days to qualify for the FEI Championship.

SPECIAL AWARDS

FREESTYLE AWARD:

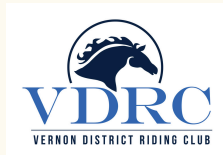
High Score Freestyle will be awarded to the highest freestyle score in either of the Bronze and Gold competitions. (min 3 horse/rider combinations required for the award)

GOLDEN YEARS AWARD:

Awarded to the highest Percentage Rider/Horse team having a combined age of 70 or more.

ADULT AMATEUR AND JUNIOR HIGH POINT AWARDS

DRESSAGE BC AWARDS:

Dressage BC Level Awards are open to AA, Open and Juniors riding Intro to FEI, Para or Western Dressage. Must hold a current DBC membership. This can be purchased through HCBC. Score requirements: three scores, including at least one from highest level (Test 3) from three different judges. An average score of 60% or higher to qualify Scores must be from BC competitions, licensed HCBC shows, and shows with licensed judges (including most schooling shows), and Equine Canada Bronze, Silver, or Gold shows. VDRC General Show Information

THE CURRENT EC RULE BOOK WILL BE IN EFFECT

Any horse entered in any class at a competition may be selected for equine medication control testing while at the event location” (A602.5).

Riders mounted on a horse must wear ASTM/SEI or BSI/BS EN approved helmet, with safety harness correctly fastened.

Only horses wearing a competition number are allowed on the grounds during competition days. The competition numbers provided by the show must be worn by the horse or rider/handler at all times the horse is on the grounds (except when in stall or trailer). Not wearing this number is grounds for potential elimination.

Appropriate footwear must be worn when mounted.

Any contestant demonstrating unsafe or unsportsmanlike behavior will be disqualified for the remainder of the show without refund of entry fees.

Dogs must be kept on leashes. Please ‘pick up’ after them!

Lunging is only allowed in the Swan Lake ring from 6:00 a.m. to 7:00 a.m. The round pen by the entry gate is open at any time for lunging.

Show management reserves the right to limit entries or refuse an entry. Show management reserves the right to decide any point not covered in the rules and correct any error or omission in the program. Protests or objections will be handled by management.

Hors Concours entries accepted at full entry fee and subject to all EC rules including EC sport licenses and EC Horse Records, but are not eligible for placings, ribbons, or awards.

Copies of the EC tests may be found at <https://www.equestrian.ca/sport/dressage/tests>. Please be sure you have the current edition of the tests. Note: 2017 amendment to Error Penalization: 1st Error = 2 points, 2nd Error = 4 points, 3rd error = elimination. However, at the discretion of the judge, the rider may continue to finish to test. See Art E 9.3.2.

It is the responsibility of the contestants to present themselves, while still mounted to the Steward immediately following their ride. Failure to do so will incur elimination. Failure to ride at your scheduled time will incur elimination. Classes may not be run in the same sequence as listed in this prize list. It is the competitors’ responsibility to check the posted schedule of ride times for any changes. Ride times may be rescheduled due to unforeseen conflicts.

Whips may be to a maximum length of 1.20m (1.00m for ponies) Test callers are permitted as per EC/FEI rules and are required to have appropriate dress.

The competition will not provide a gate keeper. If one is desired, it is the responsibility of the rider to arrange for someone to close the gate for the entire class.

Competition rings are sand footing. All tests are in a 20 x 60 m ring unless specified with entry form. Certain para dressage tests, per test requirements, will be in a 20 x 40 m ring.

VDRC General Show Information cont'd

CANCELLATIONS, SUBSTITUTIONS & REFUNDS:

Cancellations/scratches received before the closing date will have a full refund less Administration fee and credit card fee. **Substitution** of horses are permitted upon payment of the applicable substitution fee of \$27.00. If the substitution is made before the closing date, the classes entered can be changed. If the substitution is made after the closing date, the classes entered must stay the same.

Entries scratched after the closing date must provide a certificate of disability from a qualified veterinarian or physician is presented to the office by 7:30 am Saturday. If the horse has not arrived on the grounds ½ the class fees, stabling ,medic drug and dressage levy will be refunded, Admin and credit card fees will not be refunded . If the horse has arrived on the grounds stabling will not be refunded.

WARM-UP RING CODE OF CONDUCT:

Riders should pass left hand to left hand Slower gaits take the inside track The warm-up arena is for work Control your whip No lunging allowed in warm up ring after 7 am The warm-up area may limit the number of horses and rider to those preparing for their tests and cooling down after a test. use of voice to alert other riders of a movement or passing is permitted To enable all horses/riders in the warmup to focus before their tests, comments should be made as the rider passes or via 2-way communication. Please no stopping at the rail or shouting across the ring.

PARKING:

We will try to accommodate your horse trailer parking preferences. Horse trailers have priority parking near the stalls. Cars should park at the top and on the right side of driveway please.

CAMPING:

Will be in Dr.Jeff Demetrick's back field located behind the VDRC stall banks. Camping Waivers must be signed and are available at the Show Office. Dr. Demetrick kindly does this as a courtesy to our club in return that the following is respected as we do not want to lose this privilege:

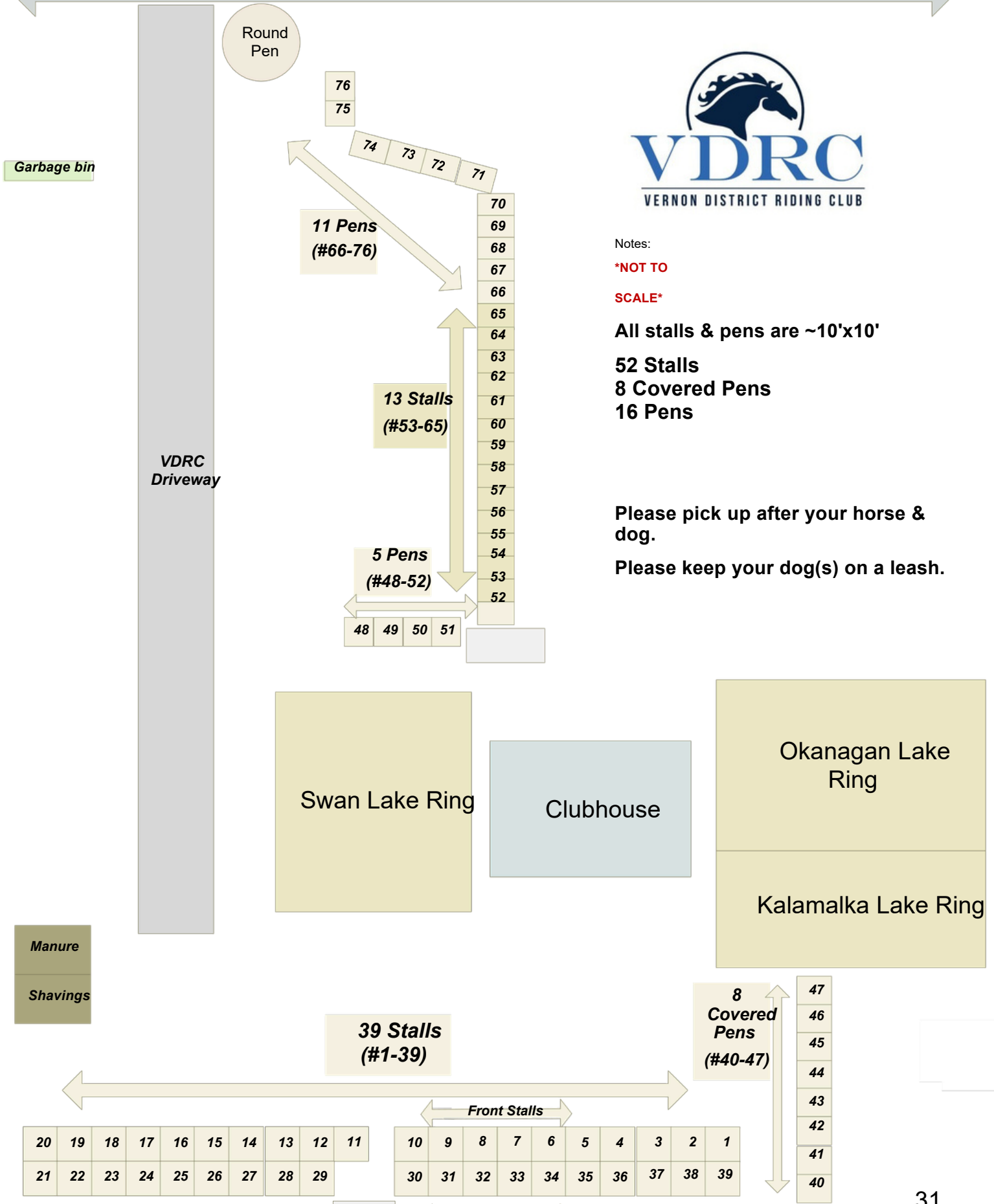
